Note on Limerick City Parish

The city of Limerick, on the banks of the Shannon, grew from a monastery founded by Saint Munchin in the sixth or seventh century. One of its great bishops, Gilbert, was Papal Legate at the Synod of Rathbrassil in 1111, which brought about the reform of the Irish Church. His involvement ensured the establishment of Limerick as an important see.

Saint Mary's Cathedral was gifted to the Church in 1168 by Donal Mhor O'Brien, the last King of Munster. Originally the site of a royal palace it has been a place of Christian worship for 850 years.

Saint Michael's Church, Pery Square was constructed as a result of the growth in Georgian Limerick. The church was built in 1844. The apse was added in 1859.

Saint John's Church, Abington is the last remaining church in the historic diocese of Emly. The present building was opened for worship in 1870.

Limerick City Parish includes a number of ancient parishes including Mungret, Saint Munchin, Saint Nicholas, Saint Laurence, Saint Patrick, Fedamore and Cahernarry.

Saint Michael's National School enrolled its first pupils in November 1882. The school was located on the present site at 11 Barrington Street and was extended in 1953, 1964 and 1968. The present classrooms were added in 1984, the numbers have risen steadily during the last decade, and there have been five mainstream class teachers since September 2008.

Saint Mary's Cathedral Bellringers

Over the year the bells have been rung on 56 occasions for service (including every Sunday morning except 2). On 39 of these occasions all eight bells were rung. Saint Mary's Cathedral again had the highest average attendance figures for all of the 36 belltowers in Ireland in 2018 with all eight bells being rung 89.8% of the Sunday service rings. Average attendance on Sundays is 12 persons and of those, 8 then go on to call people to worship at Mount St. Alphonsus, which has been the custom for many years. Monday night practices have been less well attended than in 2017. However, progress is being made with advancing ringing and skills. We have had two major social events. In June we visited Cobh Cathedral and Spike Island for our annual outing. Then, in September, Kieron Brislane organised a very enjoyable ringing and sightseeing trip to Sussex, Surrey and Kent. 7 St. Mary's ringers and 4 ringers from Christchurch, Taney rang in four village churches on the Surrey / Kent border before visiting Chartwell house (Churchill's home). On the Sunday, the ringers rang for two Sunday services at different churches in Sussex and then, after a fitting Sunday lunch, visited the Bluebell Railway and nostalgically travelled by steam train for an hour and a half.

Park & Play

2018 marked the 30 year of the Park and Play group in St Michaels Hall. The group continues to provide a regular Thursday morning venue for play and social contact for babies, toddlers and their carers. There are generally between 10 and 20 children per week from all social backgrounds and a wide range of countries.

During the year the group organised various extra activities including swimming, a trip to the theatre, a ride on the Santa Train followed by craft activities in the Hunt Museum, and a trip to "Tons of Fun" where the group held their AGM as the children played. In June the group enjoyed a fantastic day in Galway to see the National Aquarium, the excitement of interacting with the sea life was not dampened by the rain – the first wet day in many weeks! As usual a Hallowe'en party was held in aid of Temple Street Hospital, raising E200. The Christmas party was an exciting finale to the year, and everyone was delighted that Santa was able to join us!

As well as activities for the children there were several events for the parents and carers too. There was a talk on reflexology techniques for babies and toddlers, an occupational therapist gave a talk on child development and play, and there was a talk and demonstration of basic first aid techniques. Some social activities were also organised for parents and carers. A trip to the theatre to see a musical, in which one of the parents was performing was a particular highlight. Several dinner and drinks dates were also organised for the parents and carers.

Friends of Saint Mary's Cathedral

The Friends have been in existence since the 1930's and have from their inception supported the Dean & Chapter in the running of the Cathedral. As part of the Cathedral's 850th anniversary celebrations a new approach on the body was initiated, this included a Festival Service (at which the Dean of Saint Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin preached), a lunch and the launch of an annual newsletter 'Doorways'. Membership is open to all ages.

Friends of Abington

A similar body to the Cathedral Friend's, the Friends of Abington are a group of people who support and promote the ministry in Saint John's Church, Abington. The popular history day was held in June and already plans are being made for the 150th anniversary of the building in 2020.

Godly Play

Godly Play was founded by Jerome Berryman and is a creative approach to spiritual education based on the Montessori method. Jessie Rodgers, a lecturer in Theology in Maynooth University and a past parishioner in Abington introduced Godly Play to the Limerick City Parish and began presenting lessons for the children in Abington Church. She is now a trainer in Godly Play Ireland and remains a wonderful guide to me in leading Godly Play lessons.

Godly Play uses a careful telling of scripture stories, engaging story figures and a variety of creative activities to encourage children to seek and find their own answers to their faith questions. It assumes that children have some experience of the mystery of the presence of God in their lives, but that they lack the language, permission and understanding to express and enjoy that in our culture.

Our group in Abington normally meets twice in the month. It is a very small but dedicated group. We receive great support from the Dean & from the parishioners in Abington and have a lovely parish room in which we can display our materials. In 2018 we were delighted to welcome two new children to our group on two separate occasions. We had a total of 13 sessions during the year & heard stories & wondered about Epiphany, Holy Baptism, St. Valentine, Jesus & the Twelve, Knowing Jesus in a New Way, The Good Shepherd & World Communion, Jonah, the Backward Prophet, Parable of the Sower, The Great Family, The Ten Best Ways & Advent.

'Godly Play Ireland' provide training & guidance for leaders. I was delighted to be able to attend one of their sessions, a Godly Play Gathering in DCU in Dublin on 13th October. It was a really interesting & enriching day. We heard Godly Play stories being told, met other leaders from around Ireland and abroad & also made new materials for our groups.

THE PARISH SCHOOL SAINT MICHAEL'S NATIONAL SCHOOL

Saint Michael's National School now has five classroom teachers and two support teachers, with two visiting support teachers from Limerick School Project. There are two Special Needs Assistants, one full-time and one part-time. Due to increased pupil numbers and administrative workload, the school secretary now works four full days per week. The school has 127 pupils on roll with a most diverse mix of 37 nationalities and languages.

The school has just embarked on the first major building project since the extension in 1984. This will encompass a new fifth classroom, office and entrance area. This additional space will allow the school to regain use of the General Purpose Hall which has had to be utilised as two classrooms for many years. Huge fundraising efforts, such as Buy a Brick, have helped the school raise much of the necessary funds, to make up the government 20% shortfall.

This year pupils have participated in a wide range of sporting and cultural pursuits. The School Choir has performed in many services, as well as carol singing in the Crescent Shopping Centre and Richmond Terrace. The introduction of the school website has greatly enhanced the information available to parents and the wider community. Enrolments are now done online as are many other areas of administration. School life in Saint Michael's today is hugely different from those early days in 1885 when the school had 77 pupils in two rooms!

A Cathedral Business Reserve Bank Account was opened with Ulster Bank Ireland Limited (account no. 81231603) on 19 May 2006 following the transfer of monies from the Graveyard Fund bank account ($\[mathebox{\ensuremath{\mathfrak{C}}}$ 40,000) and Cathedral Restoration Project bank account ($\[mathebox{\ensuremath{\mathfrak{C}}}$ 29,000). The Tracker Bond account which matured in August 2009 was lodged to this account and credited to the Graveyard Fund and Fabric Fund in proportion to the amounts originally invested from each fund. Interest earned on this account is credited to the various funds in proportion to the amounts transferred (see page 12).

The original capital (€29,000) and accumulated interest (€2,570) relating to the Cathedral Restoration Project was transferred back to the bank account of the Restoration Project in December 2012.

Bank accounts in the name of the St. Mary's Cathedral Restoration Project are not reflected in these financial statements.

Bank accounts in the name of the Friends of St. Mary's Cathedral are not reflected in these financial statements.

We have prepared and reviewed the financial statements of Limerick City Parish (St. Mary's Cathedral) for the year ended 31 December 2018, set out on pages 4 to 10.
