



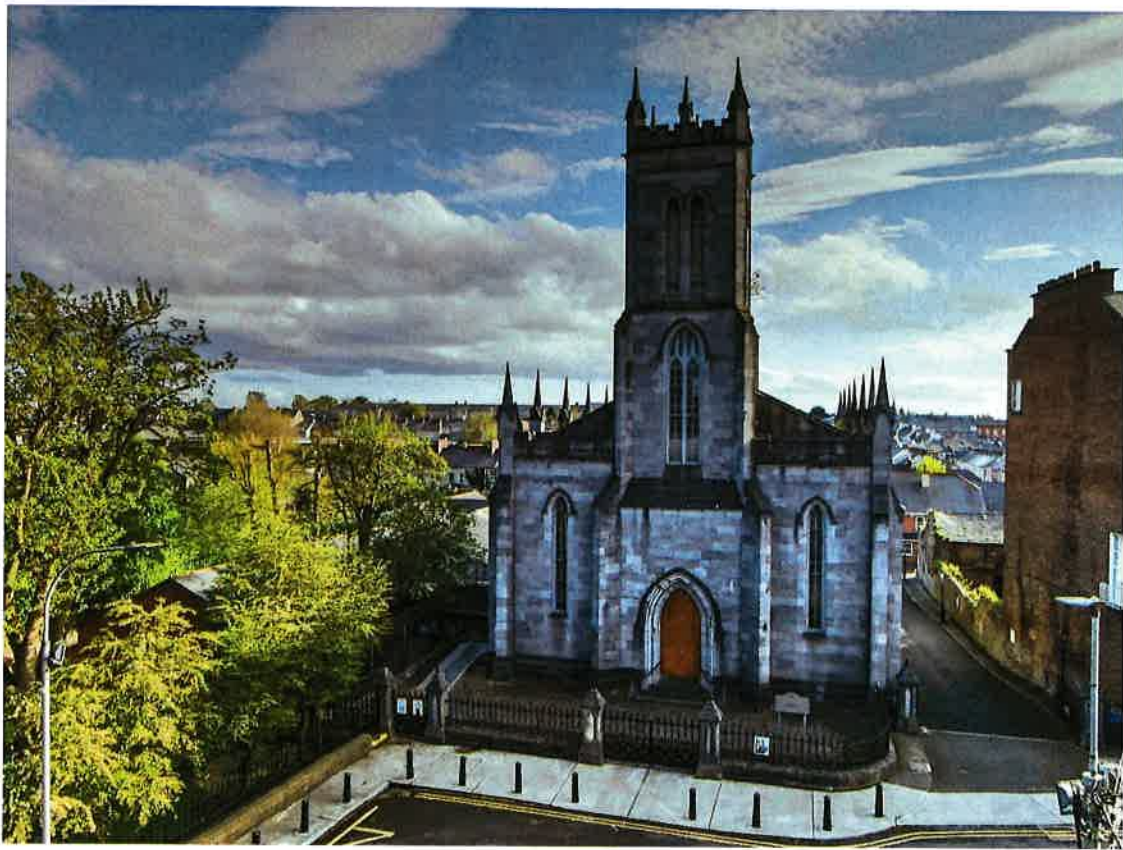

### Note on Limerick City Parish

The city of Limerick, on the banks of the Shannon, grew from a monastery founded by Saint Munchin in the sixth or seventh century. One of its great bishops, Gilbert, was Papal Legate at the Synod of Rathbrassil in 1111, which brought about the reform of the Irish Church. His involvement ensured the establishment of Limerick as an important see.

Saint Mary's Cathedral was gifted to the Church in 1168 by Donal Mhor O'Brien, the last King of Munster. Originally the site of a royal palace it has been a place of Christian worship for over 850 years.

Saint Michael's Church, Pery Square was constructed as a result of the growth in Georgian Limerick. The church was built in 1844. The apse was added in 1859.

Saint John's Church, Abington is the last remaining church in the historic diocese of Emly. The present building was opened for worship in 1870.

Limerick City Parish includes a number of ancient parishes including Mungret, Saint Munchin, Saint Nicholas, Saint Laurence, Saint Patrick, Fedamore and Cahernarry.

Saint Michael's National School enrolled its first pupils in November 1882. The school was located on the present site at 11 Barrington Street and was extended in 1953, 1964 and 1968. The present classrooms were added in 1984, the numbers have risen steadily during the last decade, and there have been five mainstream class teachers since September 2008.

## PARISH CLUBS & SOCIETIES

### Saint Mary's Cathedral Bellringers

- Over the year the bells have been rung on 57 occasions for service (including every Sunday morning except 2). On 30 of these occasions all eight bells were rung. Saint Mary's Cathedral slipped down the league tables for average attendance figures for all of the 36 bell towers in Ireland in 2019 to 5th from first, with all eight bells being rung 83.8% of the Sunday service rings.
- Average attendance on Sundays has been 10 persons and of those, at least 6 then go on to call people to worship at Mount St. Alphonsus, which has been the custom for many years. Monday night practices have been reasonably well attended in 2019, and progress is being made with advancing ringing and skills.
- Craig Copley-Brown rang his first quarter peal in January 2019.
- We currently have 2 trainee ringers – Brian Shepard and Carl Hickey.
- Two ringers – Pat Mulcahy and Adrienne Baron - required a new knee and hip respectively, which contributed to the lower than usual Sunday count.
- On recovery from his knee operation, Pat then required a triple by-pass heart operation. Fortunately he is close to resuming his ringing.
- We had a Sunday lunch (in the Clayton Hotel) for all ringers, past ringers, choir members and families in January which was well attended. A seasonally themed table quiz entertained everyone during coffee course.
- We were unable, for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, to enter a team in the RR Cherry Cup.
- At the AGM of the South District Kieron Brislane was one of 8 Ringers awarded Long Service Awards - 40 years member of the Southern District, also 50 years a member of Saint Mary's Cathedral.
- In June we visited St Nicholas Collegiate Church in Galway and a took trip on Lough Corrib for our annual outing.
- We hosted a social evening for Councillor Frankie Daly in the Cathedral, and gave him a tour of the tower – it was Cllr Daly via the Heritage Committee of Limerick City and County Council who organised for €1500 to assist pay for our new ropes (delivered late -2018)
- Three ringers attended the inaugural Cyril Galbraith Trophy in Taney – Gerry O'Shea was on the winning team.
- "Dedicated" rings included for former ringer Tom Marsden 95<sup>th</sup> birthday; and for Bishop Kenneth and Mrs Jennifer Kearon on becoming grand-parents.
- There were a "number" (5 or 6) individual visitors during the year as well as the "Rambling Ringers" and Taney (Dublin) groups.
- Had 2 separate complaints about the noise.
- Rang for 2 weddings - Meghan O'Neil and Rachel Clayton
- Former ringer and tower secretary Mary Jennings died in May 2019

### **Saint Mary's Cathedral Choir**

Our own cathedral choir visited St Canice's Cathedral, Kilkenny for a joint service of Choral Evensong with their choir and also sang evensong in St Mary's, Killarney.

The choir enjoys singing Contemporary church music as well as Baroque and Classical repertoire and we keep the tradition of singing the Psalms and Canticles. In 2019 we had a very special occasion of 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Church Consecration and choir prepared a beautiful musical programme for it.

While 2019 was a busy year in its own right, much of our time was spent planning for 2020 when we will celebrate 150 years of worship in Abington.

A Cathedral Business Reserve Bank Account was opened with Ulster Bank Ireland Limited (account no. 81231603) on 19 May 2006 following the transfer of monies from the Graveyard Fund bank account (€15,000), Fabric Fund bank account (€40,000) and Cathedral Restoration Project bank account (€29,000). The Tracker Bond account which matured in August 2009 was lodged to this account and credited to the Graveyard Fund and Fabric Fund in proportion to the amounts originally invested from each fund. Interest earned on this account was credited to the various funds in proportion to the amounts transferred (see page 11).  
The original capital (€29,000) and accumulated interest (€2,570) relating to the Cathedral Restoration Project was transferred back to the bank account of the Restoration Project in December 2012.  
This account was closed in 2019 and the respective proportions of funds were transferred back to the Fabric Fund and Graveyard Fund
