

FROM THE DEAN

Dear Parishioners.

As I reflect back on 2023, I note that it was an eventful year. I was pleased that Limerick City Parish was able to host The Irish Council of Churches AGM in the Cathedral in March, which also marked their centenary, and in May, the Ecumenical Secretaries of the Anglican 4 Nations met in Limerick. Mr Oliver Deegan was commissioned as a Diocesan Lay Reader and we wish him every blessing in this new sphere of ministry.

Like many parishes, the care of buildings is a mixed blessing — whilst we are privileged to be custodians of some beautiful churches, it often comes at a high price. The Cathedral is in good order, but there is always 'something' to be attended to. Abington installed a new heating system in 2023 and carried out some necessary repairs to the Parish Room. As I write, Saint Michael's is heading into 2024 with some major works to be carried out on the building, following the tragic fall and subsequent destruction of one of the wall memorials (thankfully no one was in the building at the time). However, we are fortunate to have some wonderful people with excellent skill sets to ensure that all these spaces are maintained for the next generation.

As mentioned all this comes at a cost and we are so thankful to our parishioners who continue to give generously.

Charity is fundamental to our Christian witness and as you will see a considerable amount of money goes to mission and charity agencies locally, nationally and globally. I'm pleased that within our parish we distributed over €24,000 to those in financial need.

Messrs Hugh Milne, Charles Irwin, Dáire McNamara, Bertie Swanton, Mrs Felicity Roche together with our parish Finance Committee (under the Chairmanship of Mr Keith Morrow) efficiently and diligently ensure all aspects of parish finances are carefully controlled. To them and Mr Colin Marsden who has assisted in the preparing of the parochial accounts – thank you.

Our Select Vestry give generously of their wisdom and skills and I pay tribute to them. As always the management of our finances is a major item on every Vestry meeting. As you will read within, thanks to careful budgeting and wise stewardship the finances of the parish are holding up. However, it is only through the generosity of parishioners that we are able to provide ministry in Limerick City and beyond.

Once again, to all those who have given – **Thank you!**

Note on Limerick City Parish

The city of Limerick, on the banks of the Shannon, grew from a monastery founded by Saint Munchin in the sixth or seventh century. One of its great bishops, Gilbert, was Papal Legate at the Synod of Rathbrassil in 1111, which brought about the reform of the Irish Church. His involvement ensured the establishment of Limerick as an important see.

Saint Mary's Cathedral was gifted to the Church in 1168 by Donal Mhor O'Brien, the last King of Munster. Originally the site of a royal palace it has been a place of Christian worship for over 850 years.

Saint Michael's Church, Pery Square was constructed as a result of the growth in Georgian Limerick. The church was built in 1844. The apse was added in 1859.

Ss John & Ailbe Church, Abington is the last remaining church in the historic diocese of Emly. The present building was opened for worship in 1870.

Limerick City Parish includes a number of ancient parishes including Mungret, Saint Munchin, Saint Nicholas, Saint Laurence, Saint Patrick, Fedamore and Cahernarry.

Saint Michael's National School enrolled its first pupils in November 1882. The school was located on the present site at 11 Barrington Street and was extended in 1953, 1964 and 1968. The present classrooms were added in 1984, the numbers have risen steadily during the last decade, and there have been five mainstream class teachers since September 2008.

Saint Mary's Cathedral Bellringers

- * 2023 was a year of up and downs, and of great loss.
- Mike Pomeroy died in March, after a long battle with cancer. Originally from Somerset he was a member of St. Mary's band since his arrival in Limerick in 1979. His influence in the bell ringing world in both Ireland and England was enormous and far-reaching, as was attested by the very large numbers of ringers from both islands who attended his funeral Service.
- Sadly, with the passing of Jean Jeffrey (November 2022) and Maud Lindsey (December 2023) Irish bell ringing family lost 2 further "giants" of the art. From Belfast, both were lifelong ringers, and were regular visitors to St. Mary's Cathedral over the last 60 years.
- Onfortunately, the number of ringing occasions fell to 43 from an average of 52 due to the refurbishment of the clappers. But the number of occasions all 8 bells were rung rose (slightly) to 17 of the 43.
- Recipient of the best Service Attendance Shield for 2023 was Kieron Brislane with 39 out of 45.
- Brian Shepard has graduated to ringing with the team on Sundays, while we have two persons "almost there". We have potentially 2 new beginners due to start early in the new year.
- St. Mary's Cathedral hosted the IACR Southern District competition (RR Cherry Cup) and the AGM in April.
- Being the Home Team must have assisted, as the Cathedral team were declared the winners at the end of the AGM.
- At the Southern District AGM Kieron Brislane was re-elected as the district secretary.
- At the AGM of the IACR Philip Talbot was elected Honorary Life Member of the Association. Congratulations to Philip on this richly deserved honour.
- The bell clappers were finally removed and sent to Matthew Higby's Engineering Works in England for much needed refurbishment. They were taken from the tower in August, and returned in November, just in time for Christmas.
- There is still some work to be completed by Higby, which is scheduled for February or March. We plan to organise a work-party to clean the belfry at the same time as this work is being done.
- We enjoyed our annual Sunday lunch in Adare in March, and our mid-summer outing to the Irish Workhouse Museum in Portumna in July.
- As was normal pre-Covid, we were able to host a small New Year's Eve party for ringers, family members and friends prior to ringing-in 2024.
- As 2023 was badly balanced on the negative side, so in 2024 we look to a better year, with hopefully 1 or 2 new ringers. Additionally, we plan a visit to Mike Pomeroy's home village in Somerset to meet his family and friends and enjoy a weekend of ringing with them.

Saint Mary's Cathedral Choir

The new choir year (September 2022) began encouragingly with seven new young singers joining the choir, ranging in age from 12 year old school children to postgraduate students from UL in their early twenties. We therefore had a good number of singers when it came to the choir's first concert collaboration of the year, when we took part in the opening concert of the 2023 Limerick Early Music Festival in mid March. This concert, hosted by the cathedral, featured two Bach Cantatas performed by the combined forces of the cathedral choir, the chamber choir Ancor and Sagittarius (the cathedral's resident vocal ensemble), together with orchestra and soloists. The programme also included four motets by some of Bach's forebears and was well received by a full cathedral.

The cathedral choir was also able to take part in a collaborative liturgical event in St Mary's in mid March, when we combined with the choir of St Nicholas' Collegiate Church, Galway and their director of music Mark Duley for a joint service of choral evensong for St Patrickstide. This collaboration was all the more appropriate with the recent appointment of the Rector of Galway, the Very Revd Lynda Peilow, as the new Precentor on the cathedral chapter.

There was another liturgical highlight in early May, when it was a privilege for the choir to sing in a special evensong with the Installation of four new Canons at St. Mary's.

Later in May St Mary's took part, together with many cathedrals across Europe, in "Cathedrals at Night" and the musical contribution was an organ recital by Peter Barley.

The Royal School of Church Music designates one Sunday a year as Music Sunday, and it's an opportunity to give thanks for the enrichment that music brings to worship in churches and cathedrals throughout the world. In St Mary's we were able to mark the day in a very particular way with the first liturgical performance by the cathedral's new junior choir. The choir first came together in September 2022 and has made great progress in its first year. RSCM Music Sunday also provided a fitting occasion to admit two young teenage choristers to full membership of the cathedral choir.

The following Sunday, 18th June, was also a busy one for the cathedral choir. In the morning we gave the world premiere of a new mass by one of our tenors, Brendan Moir. In the afternoon the choir travelled to Ballinasloe to sing choral evensong at St John's Church, where Archdeacon John Godfrey is the Rector.

With an ever present need to keep an eye to recruitment, it was great to launch two new short videos about the choir shortly before the end of the choir year, put together with great skill by one of our choir tenors, Joaquim Junior.

At the end of June we bad farewell to Brendan Moir and in early September said goodbye to Chris Hornbuckle. Both were postgraduate students at UL for one year, and had made a significant contribution to the choir during their year of study in Limerick. Brendan was

studying composition whilst Chris was a student on the Ritual, Chant and Song Course at the Irish World Academy of Music and Dance in UL. It has been great to be able to strengthen our links with this course over the past few years, aided by the cathedral's provision of choral scholarships and with the active support and encouragement of course tutor Dr Eleanor Giraud.

Just before Chris and Brendan left we were able to perform a concert of sacred music by William Byrd with Sagittarius. This concert in early July commemorated the 400th anniversary of Byrd's death, almost to the day!

As mentioned above, we had a good intake of new young singers to the choir in September 2022, and pleasingly this was matched by an equally encouraging intake in September of 2023. Four new teenage singers joined the choir and a further four youngsters joined the junior choir. Naturally the main focus of the first term of the new choir year is helping these new singers to settle in, whilst also preparing for the many important services in the second half of the term.

However we also found time to present once again our very popular concert for Leaving Certificate students featuring the Bach Cantata set work. St Mary's choir also took part with a number of other choirs in the annual concert for Limerick Mental Health Week. Following the success of last year's inaugural choir tea, we were pleased, with the Dean's kind support, to be able to run this event again in early November to welcome the significant number of new choir members.

It is good to see that more people are getting to hear about the cathedral choir, and the music training and benefits that are available to student-aged singers who are prepared to make the commitment.

As well as welcoming this encouraging number of new singers, over the past year or so we have said farewell to two longstanding members of the choir, Paddy Sirr and Michael Howes. Both of them contributed an enormous amount to the choir, not just in their loyalty Sunday by Sunday but also in much 'behind-the scenes' support of choir, choirmaster and cathedral. They will both be much missed.

Expenditure €256,804 compared to €221,804 in 2021. A surplus of €86,766 compared to a deficit of €28,895 in 2021. This surplus is attributable to increase in Rentals, Parking, Cathedral shop, Tourism and grants.

Daire McNamara presented the Saint Michael's Accounts for y/e 31 December 2022. Total Income €82,977 compared to €83,412 in 2021. Expenditure €68,413 compared to €56,910 in 2021. A surplus of €14,564 compared to a surplus of €26,502 in 2021. €20,000 was transferred to Church repairs reserve leaving a deficit for the year of €5,436. The Living Legacy balance is €44,750. The total income of The Church Repairs Reserve is €30,420 compared to €31,556 in 2021. There was no expenditure for 2022 leaving a bank balance of €130,237.

Bertie Swanton presented the Abington accounts for y/e 31 December 2022. Total income €18,172 compared to €12,597 in 2021. Expenditure €16,949 compared to €10,101 in 2021. A surplus of €1,223 compared to a surplus of €2,496 in 2021.

Rector's talk to Easter General Vestry - April 27th, 2023

Ladies and Gentlemen.

Despite going through a period of significant financial challenge, this parish managed to keep its head above water and is testament of the generosity of so many and a deep love of your parish and what it means to you. Thank you.

Secondly - Challenges

The experience of Covid-19 has presented a real challenge to us all personally as well as on a parish level. I am very conscious that many of the bonds that connected many of us to our worshipping community have been strained and broken. It is obvious that our overall attendance Sunday by Sunday has dropped, albeit not so much as in other parishes across the island, but this raises challenges for us as to how we function well as the Body of Christ in Limerick. This is not an effect of the pandemic that is particular to us however, as it has been experienced by the vast majority of my colleagues and in their parishes also. Bu thinking about 'making new disciples, as we are called to do, needs to put in within the framework of thinking through how we can reach out to those whom we have lost from our own community here as much as it may be about being open to new people coming. I hope that in the coming year we all may begin to address this.

Any changes coming out of the pandemic highlights that we need to make a concerted effort to establish a greater sense that ministry is not just about the Dean, the clergy, the readers and the few paid staff that we have but is about all of us. It is for that reason that I see the main work that we need to do in the next year as being centred on one key area — ministry to Children, young people, and young families — which with diligent pastoral care may help bring the parish into its next phase of ministry.

As I minister to young families, the primary thing which they appreciate about Limerick City Parish is the sense of community we have to offer. I seek to make this a joyous and hospitable parish. It is a complex parish with various aspects and many balls to juggle. Two historic churches, an ancient cathedral, 3 schools, a prison, 3 hospitals, multiple nursing homes, activities, and community groups. Hundreds of households in over 1600 km of parish land. But what sustains it is the commitment and dedication of its

parishioners. So, no matter what challenges lie ahead may all that we do be for the glory of God and for the building up of God's kingdom.

A few personal comments

To publicly thank my family for their patience, support and understanding. Often the Deanery family willing take second place in the parish, and I am humbled by that expression of love.

Thank you to my colleague Leonard, for the gifts he brings to this place. Not least his sense of fun.

Finally, renewed thanks to all of you for your support and encouragement in ministry. As Rector, I am acutely aware that I may not always get things right or may not always take the popular course of action and if you have found that disagreeable, I am also sorry. I am privileged and honoured to be your Rector and will continue to work with you with the best of my ability as we all seek to make God's love evident in our own lives and that of others.
