COLLECTS AND READINGS

Collect for the week: God of compassion, whose Son Jesus Christ, the child of Mary, shared the life of a home in Nazareth, and on the cross drew the whole human family to himself: Strengthen us in our daily living that in joy and in sorrow we may know the power of your presence to bind together and to heal; through Jesus Christ our Lord Amen.

Old Testament: Exodus 2: 1-10

Now a man of the tribe of Levi married a Levite woman, and she became pregnant and gave birth to a son. When she saw that he was a fine child, she hid him for three months. But when she could hide him no longer, she got a papyrus basket for him and coated it with tar and pitch. Then she placed the child in it and put it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile. His sister stood at a distance to see what would happen to him. Then Pharaoh's daughter went down to the Nile to bathe, and her attendants were walking along the riverbank. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her female slave to get it. She opened it and saw the baby. He was crying, and she felt sorry for him. This is one of the Hebrew babies, she said. Then his sister asked Pharaoh's daughter, Shall I go and get one of the Hebrew women to nurse the baby for you? Yes, go, she answered. So the girl went and got the baby's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, Take this baby and nurse him for me, and I will pay you. So the woman took the baby and nursed him. When the child grew older, she took him to Pharaoh's daughter and he became her son. She named him Moses, saying, I drew him out of the water.

Psalm 34: 11-20 (BCP p. 628)

Come, my children, and listen to me; ♦ I will teach you the fear of the Lord.

Who is there who delights in life ♦ and longs for days to enjoy good things?

Keep your tongue from evil ♦ and your lips from lying words.

Turn from evil and do good; ♦ seek peace and pursue it.

The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous • and his ears are open to their cry.

The face of the Lord is against those who do evil, ♦ to root out the remembrance of them from the earth.

The righteous cry and the Lord hears them • and delivers them out of all their troubles.

The Lord is near to the brokenhearted ♦ and will save those who are crushed in spirit.

Many are the troubles of the righteous; ♦ from them all will the Lord deliver them.

He keeps all their bones, ♦ so that not one of them is broken.

Epistle Reading: 2 Corinthians 1: 3-7

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ. If we are distressed, it is for your comfort and salvation; if

we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which produces in you patient endurance of the same sufferings we suffer. And our hope for you is firm, because we know that just as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our comfort.

Gospel: Luke 2:33-35

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

Post Communion Prayer: God of mercies, your only Son, while hanging on the cross, appointed Mary, his mother, to be his beloved disciple's mother. May we follow her good example and always care for others for the sake of Jesus Christ our Saviour through whose name we pray.

SafeTALK Training: Friday 2nd May at Mount St. Anne's Retreat Centre, Killenard, Co. Laois, I 0am-4pm. The Church of Ireland Youth Department, supported by the Church of Ireland Mindmatters campaign, is offering free training in supporting people with thoughts of suicide. The content will apply to all people, including teenagers and adults, at risk of suicide. Given the content, SafeTALK is not recommended for anyone bereaved by suicide in the last I2 months. SafeTALK is open for anyone who is likely to come into contact with people suffering from suicidal ideation: clergy, volunteer leaders, chaplains, youth leaders and DYOs.
